PF Olsen Toolbox Safety Alert 30

Date: 28 July 2020	Focus Group: ATV Operators			
Topic: Maintenance Checks and Records	Issued by: Craig Fisher			

Background and Incident: Climbing a farm track, the front CV joint broke causing an ATV to lose traction and slide backwards. With only two wheels driving, the 6-seater (with driver only) momentarily stopped against a small tree before sliding another short distance and finally stopping against a larger tree.

Injury Details: Nil to the operator and ATV, which required a CV joint replacement.

Risk Awareness: Mud can cover ATV drive componentry and obscure faults, causing the ATV to malfunction at times when there is a serious risk of harm or damage.

Safe Behaviours: The <u>ACOP 6.5.1</u> states that "Mobile plant shall be maintained in a safe operating condition in accordance with the manufacturer's specifications" and therefore it is essential to follow these four key maintenance tips:

- Use an authorised service agent to regularly service the ATV (usually 100 hours).
- Complete the Daily ATV <u>Inspection and Maintenance Checklist.</u> Remember to record the date of the first inspection, then each weekly inspection thereafter.
- Know your ATV if something feels or sounds different stop, check, and fix!
- Ask for help get a second opinion and report any findings to your manager.
