**Background and Incident:** A eucalyptus log slipped on a truck in transit on its way to the pulp mill. The harvesting crew were unaware of the '3-day from de-barking' rule.

**Injury Details:** Nil to personal and no damage. The log had slipped 2 meters.

**Risk Awareness:** There is increased risk around transportation, loading and unloading of peeled eucalyptus logs given the slippery nature of these logs. A log lost during transit may cause serious harm to other road users, damage the carrying unit and/or other vehicles using the road.

**Safe Behaviours:** Forest Owners must ensure adequate room to enable the safe storage of peeled logs for a minimum for 3 days from de-barking; or longer if the logs have had insufficient exposure to sunlight and air circulation and are still wet and slippery. Some key rules are listed below – however please refer to the OFS BPG.

- Exercise extra care during loading to prevent logs slipping and causing damage.
- Construct loads evenly (level), uniformly (similar lengths) and avoid butt stacking.
- Loads must be properly crowned with the logs preferably set below the stanchions.
- Eucalyptus load packets must be belly chained having a minimum of 3 restraints.
