Background and Incidents: During planting operations, a bull entered the area, displaying unpredictable behavior and potential aggression. Workers maintained a safe distance until the bull moved away after lunchtime.

Injury Details: No injuries occurred during this incident. However, the presence of aggressive livestock poses significant safety risks in planting and established areas.

Risk Awareness: Encounters with unpredictable cattle during establishment on farms can lead to injuries due to sudden movements or aggression. Agitated or isolated cattle are a particular risk. Handling them safely requires skill and practice.

Safe Behaviours: To minimise risk, those working in establishment must:

- Stay Vigilant: Remain alert for livestock entering planting areas. Report any fresh signs (droppings, rutting) and sightings immediately.
- Maintain Distance: Keep a safe distance from cattle displaying aggressive behavior. Do not attempt to approach or manage them without proper training.
- Emergency Response: Plan escape routes in advance. Ensure all workers know how to safely exit the area if confronted by aggressive animals. Keep cattle calm.
- Worksafe's <u>Cattle Handling Principles</u> provide guidance on the hazards and injury prevention, such as mustering using a tractor instead of on-foot or ATV interactions.
- Report Incidents: Immediately notify supervisors of any encounters with livestock.
 Identify local 'cattle handlers' who can provide prompt assistance if necessary.
